**DISCUSSION QUESTION:** 1 Timothy 6:6–8 teaches that godliness with contentment is great gain. Where do you struggle with contentment, and what helps you find satisfaction in Christ?

**DISCUSSION QUESTION:** Paul warns Timothy about the dangers of loving money (1 Timothy 6:9–10). How can Christians hold wealth responsibly without letting it control their hearts?
